| Secondly, conversion into quintile classes/groups is to be done. The data are ordered according to the value of the equivalised total net monthly income of the household. Four cut-point values (the so-called quintiles) of income, dividing all the survey population into five groups equally represented/frequent by 20 % of respondents are found. 20 % respondents with lowest income are coded 1, ..., and 20 % respondents with highest income are coded 537. | | | |
